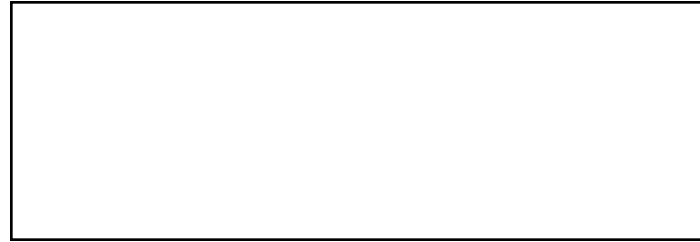

The big question is.....how are we doing financially?

We are slowly building a substantial bank account but not enough to complete our project as yet. These funds are the result of donations, both large and small, from the general public and we appreciate everyone's donation from the smallest to the largest. Every donation is important.

We are using all available fundraising sources. We have retained 2 grant writers who are working diligently to raise our necessary funds. They are blanketing the country with grant requests.

It has become evident to us that we must go through a series of studies prior to being considered for major grants. These studies are expensive and time-consuming, but must be completed before any funding sources would consider our applications.

Keep in mind that a project of this size will proceed slowly. The Tom Ridge Environmental Center, a highly successful project, took between 10 and 15 years to reach completion. Our anticipated goal of 2012, due to the national economic restraints, does now seem a little too optimistic; however, on all other areas of the project, we are on schedule.

Our volunteers do all of our own printing, mailing, PR, etc. We have no employees, but our volunteers have logged over 17,000 hours valued at over \$330,000. We are also on Facebook and Twitter and have PayPal on our website.
